

Child Abuse Identification and Reporting Seminar

In 1998 New York State established a new, one-time requirement for many licensed professionals, teachers and school administrators to complete a two-hour training seminar in the identification and reporting of child abuse and maltreatment.

The law states that a person applying for the renewal of a license, registration, certificate or limited permit must provide documentation that he or she has completed the required training. The two-hour seminar will cover the statutory reporting requirements of the New York State Social Services Law and the physical and behavioral indicators of child abuse. The format primarily consists of lecture and discussion.

Concordia has been approved by the state of New York to offer this seminar to assist you in meeting state requirements.

A copy of the New York State Education Department Certificate of Completion will be issued following the seminar.

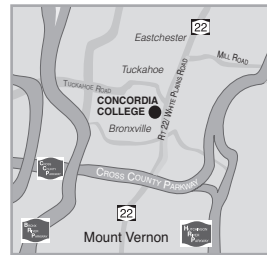

From New York City, New Jersey and Upstate New York

Take the New York State Thruway (Major Deegan Expressway/Route 87) to the Cross County Parkway (east) to exit 8, Route 22/Columbus Ave. The College is located 1.5 miles north.

From Long Island

Take the Hutchinson Parkway (off the New England Thruway) north to the Cross County Parkway, exit 13, heading west. Continue on the Cross County Parkway to exit 8, Route 22/Columbus Ave. At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Route 22. The College is located 1.5 miles north.

From Connecticut

Take the Merritt Parkway to the Hutchinson Parkway south to Mill Road, exit 18, heading west. At the end of the ramp, turn right onto Mill Road and continue to the fifth traffic light, Route 22/White Plains Road. The College is located one mile south.
