CONCORDIA COLLEGE OFFERS NEW COURSES OF STUDY IN HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATION & HEALTH STUDIES

Bronxville, NY—Concordia College-New York has announced two new Bachelor's of Science degrees in the healthcare field, the number one growth industry of the 21st century in the United States: Health Studies and Healthcare Administration.

The Health Studies Program is offered to both traditional undergraduate and Accelerated Degree (Adult Education) students. Not only does this program of study open careers in traditional fields such as nursing and social work, but it also broadens opportunities in fields that do not require pre-licensing education. Students will study careers in care coordination, care transition, cultural sensitivity to diverse populations, communication, healthcare supervision and management, and industry leadership. The program results in a stronger understanding of other areas directly related to healthcare, such as Biology, Psychology, Social Work, and Sociology. Health Studies encourages the development of analytical and critical thinking, oral and written communications skills, and research and writing skills. Also, students will be introduced to issues in the health field such as socio-cultural influences on health, health behavior and management, legal and ethical concern, health promotion, and environmental influences on health, nutrition, mental health, life cycle health, and alternative/complementary medicine. Students who complete this area of study can find jobs in hospitals, research facilities, and schools. This program has a foundation in Liberal Arts and Sciences which may be needed for professional studies, but does not result in a certification or licensure.

Healthcare Administration is only offered to Accelerated Degree students. This program is beneficial to adult students wishing to pursue a career in a health-related area. The courses and class sessions are at an accelerated pace that is meant to accommodate the schedule of the student. Upon finishing this program of study, the student can expect to find careers in the healthcare sector, hospitals, health departments, health agencies, living assistance, and the health industry. Like Health Studies, this program has a foundation in Liberal Arts and Sciences that are required for professional studies, but does not lead to a certification or licensure.
