Musical Theatre Workshop Camp

Grades 2 – 5	June 29 – July 17	9:00 – Noon
Grades 6 – 8	June 29 – July 17	1:00 – 4:00

This three week summer workshop will produce its own end-of-camp, one-act musical theatre production. The musical theatre workshop camp will focus on basic vocal technique, drama skills and choreography. The first week of camp consists of the process of writing the musical. The second week is focused on learning the music and lines, staging the production, and character development. The third week will be dedicated to the rehearsal and performance. The end-of-camp performance is open to the public.

The camp workshop is skill-based, giving each student a unique opportunity to study the many aspects of the musical theatre experience. Our Conservatory musical theatre staff is interested in the development of the individual on a non-competitive basis. Values and respect are part of the experience, guided by care and support of our musical theatre staff.

Piano Camp

Grades 2 – 8 <i>(one or more year's private instruction)</i>	June 29 – July 17	1:00 – 5:00

Guitar Jam Camp

Grades 1 – 3 <i>(beginners only)</i>	June 29 – July 17	9:00 – Noon
Grades 2 – 8 <i>(one or more year's private instruction)</i>	June 29 – July 17	1:00 – 5:00

Students at Guitar Camp have the opportunity to play guitar in a variety of styles, from rock power chords and folk strumming to jazz/blues "comping" and classical style. Participants will enjoy activities including playing in bands, lead-guitar soloing, improvisation, rhythm, guitar history, music reading, composition and theory as well as music games and recreation. Supportive teachers and classmates make this a camp for both beginners as well as more experienced musicians. The morning camp is for beginners, grades 1 – 3 with no experience. The afternoon class is for students in grades 2 – 8 who have had one or more years of private instruction.

Chamber Music

Chamber music provides students with the opportunity to enhance their performance skills, and expand their musical insight and awareness through coaching sessions. The faculty coach's role is to be a musical guidance counselor/facilitator.

The objective of the chamber music is to provide the students with knowledge and practice in the following areas:

- Reading a musical score: analyzing and evaluating
- Preparing the individual musical parts and learning non-verbal techniques of communication
- Active learning and performing
- Believing in yourself- every member of the group is important

Chamber Music is for students in grades 2 – 12 who have had one or more years of private instruction. Chamber Music participants will be grouped according to their skill level. Students exposed to the Chamber Music experience gain strength as individuals by means of group effort. And, chamber music is fun!

Vocal Arts Camp

Grades 6 – 12 June 29 – July 17 1:00 – 5:00

The Vocal Arts Camp is an immersive learning experience for middle and high school singers. This three-week program includes bi-weekly private voice lessons with a faculty member, extensive performance opportunities, coaching sessions with pianists, audition technique classes and master classes.

Working with a team of teacher/specialists, students explore the distinctive challenges of the musical theatre genre and classical song repertoire through survey work with songs, characterizations, vocal work, games, Alexander technique and stage movement.

Conservatory Summer Academy

Grades 3 – 12 July 20 – 24 9:00 – 7:00

For the first time ever, Concordia Conservatory will host a week-long, all-day camp! The Summer Academy is intended for musicians of all instruments and voice ages 8 - 18 who are interested in an intensive week of music-making.

The Academy will feature chamber music, theory, music history, daily master classes and performances, trip to summer music festival and more. Daily recreation, lunch and dinner will be provided.

This is a wonderful opportunity to build independence, long-lasting friendships, and immersion in a unique non competitive, nurturing program that caters to boys and girls ages 8 to 16 who want to immerse themselves in a daily, week-long music camp.

Private Instruction

June 29 – August 7

Concordia Conservatory offers private lessons for a six-week session in piano, voice, guitar (acoustic, bass and electric), violin, viola, cello, bass, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon and saxophone. Lessons are 30, 45, or 60 minutes in length and are open to children and adults. Students can register for as few as one or as many as six lessons. Due to this shorter commitment, the summer private instruction is an ideal time for students new to the Conservatory or for a current student to enjoy music instruction throughout the summer. An interview is required for first-time students to determine teacher placement. When scheduling, if a mutually convenient lesson time and day cannot be agreed upon, the lesson fees will be fully refunded. Lessons will start being scheduled the first week of June. Students are scheduled in the order of receipt of the registration form and payment in the Conservatory office.
