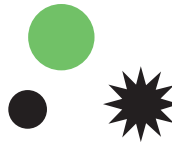
Early Childhood Extended Day

In addition to the morning Enrichment Program, we are pleased to offer an Extended Day Program, from 12:00-2:00 PM. **This program is only offered to those children who participate in the morning Enrichment Program.** The Extended Day Program begins at noon with lunch in the College Dining Hall. At 12:45, the children enjoy outdoor organized games and free play, allowing them to develop their large motor skills. They will also participate in art activities, building on their learning experiences from the morning Enrichment Program.

- Children will be grouped by their birthdays, not by the grade they will be entering in September.
- Children must have completed one year of nursery school, must have reached the age of 3 on or before June 1, 2008, and must be toilet-trained.

THE EARLY CHILDHOOD SPORTS PROGRAM is designed to provide exercise, enhance physiological development, and promote enthusiasm for physical activity for the pre-kindergarten/kindergarten child.

Activities for the pre-school child are: running games, mini-hoop basketball, sponge polo, throwing, catching, batting, soccer, kickball, and water-play. Motor skill development and growth are the goals of this program through active play and instruction. Most instruction takes place through activities and lead-up games for team sports. Campers are grouped by age into small groups, under the supervision of qualified counselors. Time is set aside each day for rest and quiet play.

- Bowling: All campers will go bumper bowling at least once during each three-week session at Homefield Bowl in Yonkers.
- Optional swimming program (additional \$80 per Session): the primary focus of this unique program is to take the campers to the beautiful Sprain Ridge Pool in Hastings-on-Hudson for recreational swimming in wading pools 2-feet deep. If it is raining on the scheduled swim day, the campers are taken bowling. In either case, the campers who sign up for this program go offsite at least four times each session for a fun-filled afternoon. The optional swimming portion of the Early Childhood Sports Program is available to campers attending the 12:00-3:00 program, as well as the 12:00-5:00 program and involves recreational, not instructional, swimming in wading pools 2-feet deep. For the safety reasons and optimal supervision, all campers are considered non-swimmers. **SUMMER AT CONCORDIA'S** certified lifeguards and Assistant Sports Director will supervise swimming. On swimming days, campers are expected to wear their bathing suits and bring their own towel to camp. If children choose not to participate in swimming, sports and/or water activities are offered on the Concordia campus, including spray toys and sprinklers.
- Harris Transportation provides yellow school bus transportation, with certified bus drivers, for the bowling and optional swimming elements of the Sports program. Counselors accompany campers on the bus to and from swimming and bowling activities.
- Lunch is provided in the College Dining Hall, where the campers eat with their counselors. Meals include pizza, hamburgers, chicken nuggets, pasta, tacos, hot dogs, cream cheese and jelly sandwiches. In addition, a fresh salad bar is always available. Also included are beverages and fruit. A mid-afternoon snack is provided, including juice and cookies or Sun Chips, pretzels, ice pops etc.
- *Children will be grouped by their birthdays, not by the grade they will be entering in September.*
- *Children must have completed one year of nursery school, must have reached the age of 3 on or before December 31, 2007, and must be toilet-trained.*

Piano Camp

Grades 1 – 3 <i>(beginners only)</i>	June 30 – July 18	9:00 – Noon

This three week camp offers pianists the opportunity to experience playing piano with each other. Pianists often play their instrument alone and the Piano camp offers them a chance to play two or three together on one piano. Other aspects of the camp include theory and ear training, music history, and collaborative projects with the guitar camp. Campers will receive both private and group instruction – taught and grouped according to their level. Also included will be music games, theory, recreation, snack and great music-making! The morning class is for beginners, ages 6 – 8 with no experience. The afternoon class is for students in grades 2 – 8 who have had one or more years of private instruction.

Chamber Music

- Preparing the individual musical parts and learning non-verbal techniques of communication

- Believing in yourself – every member of the group is important
- Performing at the Sommer Center – a hall with one of the best acoustics for chamber music in the tri-state area

All skill levels are welcome. Chamber music participants will be grouped according to their skill level. Students exposed to the chamber music experience gain strength as individuals by means of group effort. And, Chamber Music is fun! Lunch Options

An additional lunch fee of \$80 will be charged for campers who are enrolled in the Conservatory Morning Program and will attend the afternoon Extended Day or Conservatory Program. Campers going from the Morning Enrichment Program to the afternoon Conservatory offerings, will also be charged for lunch.

Private Instruction

June 30 – August 8

Concordia Conservatory offers private lessons and chamber music coachings from June 30 – August 8 on a weekly basis. We will offer private lessons in piano, voice, guitar (acoustic, bass and electric), violin, viola, cello, bass, flute, oboe, clarinet, and saxophone. Lessons will be 30, 45, or 60 minutes in length and are open to children and adults, students must be able to read to begin private instruction. An interview is required for first-time students to determine teacher placement.

As many as six lessons, or a few as one lesson, may be taken during the summer term. Lessons will be scheduled the first week of June. When scheduling, if a mutually convenient lesson time and day cannot be agreed upon, the lesson fees will be fully refunded. Students are scheduled in the order of receipt of the registration form and payment to the Conservatory office.

Utilizing the beautiful Concordia College athletic fields, gyms, and facilities, the Elementary and Middle School Sports program focuses on teamwork, sportsmanship, technique, strategy, and an appreciation for sports and friendly competition. The program includes baseball, soccer, softball, basketball, volleyball, tennis, kickball, badminton, lacrosse, bowling, pickleball, team handball, floor hockey, golf, team dodgeball, water-play, and other age-appropriate activities, all in a safe, friendly, and fun-filled environment. Good sportsmanship will be an important component of this program. Campers are grouped by age level, into small groups.

Back this year: our popular Martial Arts Program, taught by the excellent instructors from the Westchester Martial Arts Academy of Eastchester. Campers from first grade and up will be introduced to the basics of Martial Arts, as incorporated by **Muay Thai Kickboxing and Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu!** Muay Thai Kickboxing teaches children: Effective partner training and teamwork, coordination and sports conditioning, self-confidence and self-discipline. **Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu** teaches children how to double their physical power with the proper application of leverage and how to escape the most difficult holds.

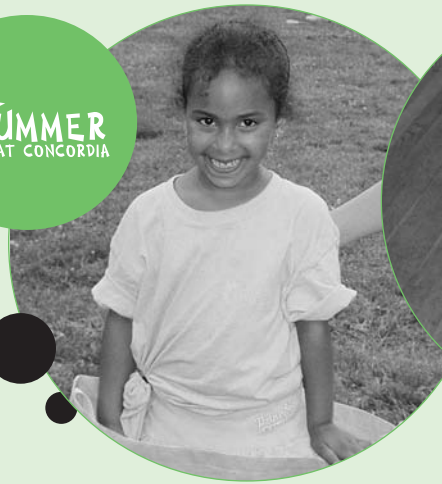
The Sports Program for younger campers will continue to emphasize learning the skills and fundamentals of a variety of team and individual sports. For older campers, the program enables the children to improve their skill levels, develop a deeper understanding of strategies in competition, and experience advanced development of each sport.

- Optional swimming program (additional \$80 per Session): the primary focus of this unique program is to provide the opportunity for recreational swim under the supervision of our certified lifeguards, Assistant Director and counselors at the beautiful Sprain Ridge Pool in Hastings-on-Hudson. If it is raining on the scheduled swim day, the campers are taken bowling. In either case, the campers who sign up for this program go offsite at least four times each session for a fun-filled afternoon.

The optional swimming portion of the offsite program involves recreational, not instructional, swimming in water that is chest-high or lower. For the safety of all campers, all swimmers will be considered non-swimmers, regardless of their swimming proficiency. **SUMMER AT CONCORDIA'S** certified lifeguards and Assistant Sports Director will supervise swimming. On swimming days, campers are expected to wear their bathing suits and bring their own towel to camp. If children choose not to participate in swimming; sports and/or water activities are offered here at Concordia, including spray toys and sprinklers.

- Bowling: All campers will go bowling at least once during each camp session.
- Lunch is provided in the College Dining Hall, where the campers eat with their counselors. Meals include pizza, hamburgers, chicken nuggets, pasta, tacos, hot dogs, cream cheese and jelly sandwiches. In addition, a fresh salad bar is always available. Also included are beverages and fruit. A mid-afternoon snack is provided, including juice and cookies or Sun Chips, pretzels, ice pops etc.
